Standing Rules Enforcement Effective Immediately

Aloha Members,

The COVID-19 cases continue to rapidly increase here in Hawaii. Effective immediately we will be enforcing the following standing rules:

II. IDENTIFICATION OF MEMBERS

A. A Member must show his/her Membership card upon request

III. GUESTS

A. All guests must be registered in the guest book by the Member acting as their host/hostess

B. Guests are not allowed to purchase liquor at the bar.

You can expect the following changes starting today:

- Daily gate watch starting today
- You will be required to present your membership card to order food/drink
- Guests will only be allowed into the club if you are present
- Crew members of racing yachts will be required to sign in to a crew sheet

Captains of race boats will have to approve crew added to the crew sheet.

Aloha members,

We continue to adjust to changing pandemic realities with new procedures, new HYC Galley hours, and new safety measures. The club also has several improvement projects underway.

The Bylaws and Standing Rules have been brought up to date with all changes incorporated. New mooring rules have been proposed and posted on the bulletin board for the 30-day review and comment period. The comment period is important: we received some excellent comments, incorporated them into the document, and reposted for a new 30-day comment period.

The club rules about non-members being required to be hosted by a member and not being able to purchase food and drink are being enforced now. This has been a perennial issue because we want to be inclusive of the Friday night racers and offshore racers, but then the rules are difficult to enforce at other times. After much board discussion, the rules have been reiterated and clarified in an e-blast. Along with that, we will be coordinating volunteers again for the front door, and flag officers and governors will be acting as officers of the deck.

- All off-island catches must be done on a certified scale, inform RC of power of details.
- After catching a fish, you need to email the RC for Power with the following information:
 - Name, membership #, boat name, fish caught, weight with the time & location of catch.
 - Provide a photograph of the catch to the RC for Power and submit to the HYC Facebook page.

Prize fish categories:

Fish minimum weight prize monthly yearly winner

- Ahi 15 lbs. \$40.00 * \$100.00
- Mahi 15 lbs. \$40.00 * \$100.00
- Ono 15 lbs. \$40.00 * \$100.00
- Bill fish 50 lbs. \$60.00 * \$100.00

Summary:

- Winners will be acknowledged in the HYC Facebook and HYC Bulletin monthly.
- If no winner in a category the prize will be rolled over to the next month.
- Prize money will be a paid gift certificate to the HYC.
- At the end of the year a grand prize will be awarded to the winner for the year.
