

TREASURER'S REPORT



Aloha fellow members,

Thanks to all the members who have their automatic payment on file authorizing credit card for all fees and dues on the 1st of each month. (Those who have not done so will need to see the office to do so and bring their account current to return to good standing. A list of members in arrears is posted at the office.) And thanks for compliance with the No Cash policy currently in effect.

As reported at the April General Membership (GM) Meeting, there was ~\$100,000 in the checking account after outstanding checks were paid and \$42,000 in the Maximizer Savings Account.

Membership was informed that it cost HYC \$117,000 to operate for the month of March; we brought in \$119,000 in revenue in March. We need to continue to bring in more than expenses each month to remain solvent. This month the Galley drainpipe replacement work (~\$6,000) was funded out of necessity and priority. More maintenance items will be prioritized and funded as the year progresses and funds allow.

Members were asking when **music would return to HYC** and therefore we funded every other Saturday in April. We are planning to have music every Saturday in May and will alternate the talent. For music to continue, **we need members to support the effort**. After getting good reviews, Brant Swigart is scheduled again for May 6, 13, and 27, 2023, playing dinner music from Jim Croce, Cat Stevens, James Taylor, The Beatles, The Eagles, and Gordon Lightfoot among others. Our bar manager, Kevin, is working on scheduling other talent for Saturday May 20th.

As for our outlook, we need to keep in mind that January 2023 had the biggest collection of revenue of any month of the year, so we will have to see what will happen in April, May, and June.

We need all membership to come in and support the club. HYC appreciates <u>ALL</u> members working together as *ohana*. Let's continue to work together to make the remainder of this year a financial success.

Continuing our Hawaiian word of the month I thought about choosing something meaningful. After some soul-searching I came up with *kuleana* [kule.ana] which generally means responsibility. I chose that word as a reminder that it is all our responsibility to keep the club a welcoming space in good condition as well as welcoming new members personally. Thanks to those who worked replacing the floor in the downstairs area which helps keep the club shipshape and lets us proudly show new members around.

We are planning an open house membership event after Transpac and we welcome any ideas and suggestions on how to get more members into the club. The Board has brought back live music and is open to suggestions such as jazz or other attractions.

I'd like to start using this forum to highlight a new or existing member's biography (with their explicit approval). Many of our members are interesting and inspiring individuals! Let me start this month by featuring Jason Arnold. Jason is a new H2O member, lives in Honolulu, and currently works as a firefighter for the City & County of Honolulu. He volunteered in 2009 to crew on the *Princess Tai Ping*, a replica Chinese junk that crossed the Pacific Ocean from Honolulu and Okinawa, and then back again to Honolulu. They set sail on February 17, 2009 with 10 crew members and sailed unassisted to Wake Island, Saipan, and Okinawa. After 63 days of voyaging, they set sail from Okinawa on April 22,2009 for their final 3-day leg to make maritime history. The voyage was the first time a Chinese Junk double crossed the Pacific in recorded history--quite an interesting and somewhat unusual journey! I know Jason would be happy to elaborate a bit more, perhaps over a cold beverage at the bar. Congratulations to Jason on this great achievement.

SPECIAL SECTION

At our most recent General Membership Meeting on April 18, 2023, HYC Member Scott "Cloudwatcher" Allen provided an overview of the legislation affecting our harbor and boating activities. We thought you might find his report interesting...

Whether you were in room 309 awaiting the words "we have a bill" or crossing your fingers hoping to learn that the measure you have opposed this entire session had died, the energy coursing through the crowd at the Capitol was contagious. Now that the last of the conference committees have gaveled in and the day of final decking has passed, we can begin to step back and reflect on our state's legislative session, the direction charted by our political leadership, and, perhaps more importantly, what this means for our harbor community.

This legislative session saw several measures introduced, from attempts to tighten restrictions on mooring areas (SCR115) to setting the stage for privatization of the Ala Wai Small Boat Harbor (HB1089). I have compiled a list of these measures which you can access here or by scanning the QR code. Three measures, in particular, I will discuss in this brief: House Bill 1089 (HB1089), which has been deferred until the next legislative session (January 2024), House Bill 422 (HB422), which failed to gain traction, and Senate Resolution 162 (SR162), which was adopted.

The primary objective of *HB1089* was to change the Hawai'i Revised Statutes (HRS) to allow the Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation (DOBOR) to lease Ala Wai Small Boat Harbor in its entirety. Two major differences between how HRS currently reads and what this bill would change are that DOBOR would not need legislative approval for leasing the harbor and they would be able to lease the mooring areas (submerged lands). DOBOR believes including submerged lands in the lease will increase the odds of attracting a private developer to redevelop Ala Wai Small Boat Harbor based on the Vision Report prepared by the University of Hawaii Community Design Center (UHCDC). You can find this report in the document linked above and in the QR code.

HB422 aimed to establish an advisory committee to inform decisions related primarily to harbor maintenance. The measure sounds as though the advisory committee would function similar to OHA, but would have only a few appointed positions from harbor users across the state and the committee wouldn't be involved with decisions related to harbor management. Finally, *Senate Resolution 162* (SR162) will require the State Auditor to conduct a comprehensive management audit of DOBOR due to mounting concerns about their operations. This audit is meant to measure how much progress has been made since the previous comprehensive management audit in 2001.
