RACE FOR THE RED

Dear Members of Hawaii Yacht Club and Waikiki Yacht Club,

Three years ago we brainstormed how to do something that gave back to the community. We came up with a charity race that raises funds that stay in Hawaii: The **RACE FOR THE RED.** Both Waikiki Yacht Club and Hawaii Yacht Club are committed to this event.

A challenge was accepted to generate funds and fun. Each boat entered can raise money in the name of the boat. For every \$50 donated, one minute is taken off of the boat's finish time. Crew can tap into family and friends; Red Cross creates a QR code and link so that the donations go directly to Red Cross. Red Cross keeps record of all monies donated per boat. The total for each boat is added up and minutes are taken off of each boat's finish time.

The first year we raised \$6000+.

Last year we asked companies and businesses to sponsor the race. We got a great response! Crazy Shirts donated 150 shirts and the names of the sponsors were printed on the back. Every crew member and volunteer received a T-Shirt. It was a WAVE of Red out there!!

Last year we raised over \$17,000. You know that money was needed in Maui.

We have a lot of fun fabulous races and events scheduled this year, but take note: THIS IS THE MOST IMPORTANT RACE OF THE YEAR.

Celebration of Life


