RC SAIL REPORT

Hello members and friends,

Five boats competed and completed the *Holo Holo* nonstop race around Oahu this year on Saturday, September 30th. This race is similar to Friday nights with a staggered start. Starting first was *Whisper* at 10:00 a.m., followed by *Reactor* at 10:05, *Zephyr* at 11:21, *Alize* at 11:31, and *Knot Right* at 12:27. The racers get to choose which direction they round Oahu. This year the fleet was split. *Whisper* and *Zephyr* took a left out of the channel while the rest took the more common route, right.

Winds were quite strong, gusting well into the mid- to high-20s. *Zephyr* and *Whisper* had a challenging upwind start while the rest were easy cruising downwind. That of course switches as they round the island. In the late afternoon, all the boats were between Kahuku and Ka'ena points. *Reactor*, *Alize*, and *Knot Right* were tacking upwind past Haleiwa while *Zephyr* and *Whisper* were hitting record downwind speeds. Top speeds were 17 knots on *Zephyr* and 16 knots on *Whisper*.

The make it or break it point for the counterclockwise boats, *Zephyr* and *Whisper*, would be the lee on the west side. If you can make it through, you're in good shape; but if you get stuck, you can be stuck for hours. *Whisper* and *Zephyr* had multiple lead changes during this stretch as they each found wind then lost it. Luckily for them, they were only becalmed for a half hour. They made it through in the wee hours of the morning, stuck their noses past Barbers Point, and were off and running towards the finish.

- Second Place Whisper Steve Stock 5:39 am
- Third Place Alize Billy Bowers 6:10 am
- Fourth Place Knot Right Joe Bardouche 6:38 am
- Fifth Place Reactor Jade York 9:43 am

This was the first *Holo Holo* race for the skippers of *Zephyr*, *Whisper*, and *Alize*. Shout out to Billy on *Alize*. He was the only KYC boat to venture over to compete. Well done Jade on *Reactor*! She broke her main halyard halfway through the race but refused to withdraw. She and her crew finished the race under jib only.

There's just one race left on the HYC Calendar: *Pau Wahine* is October 28th. Get your *wahine* crew and skippers ready and we will see you on the water!

Before I get started, I'd like to announce that I will be going on my first post-Covid vacation next month, leaving on October 9th and returning on October 29th. Please send inquiries about membership to the office email at office@hawaiiyachtclub.org.

We had success converting and signing more than a dozen new members during our last membership drive. As of now we have the following memberships on our roster: 136 Regular, 88 H2O, 233 Associates, 37 Senior, 29 Honorary, 55 Life, 21 Military, and 1 Corporate membership.

Those numbers may look like a lot, but they are insufficient in light of the many needed repairs to our property and the long-term financial health of the club. In short, we will be doing membership drives on a quarterly basis. The next one is scheduled between Thanksgiving and Christmas. The exact date will be announced shortly, at which time I would like to invite volunteers to help. This is a perfect event for our new H2O members to get their mandatory hours of volunteer time in. IKAIKA / PADDLING REPORT

Hawaii Yacht Club has provided Ikaika Hawaii with an ideal environment for preparing athletes to compete at the national and international levels. We have found the right balance of having truly rewarding fun, developing important life skills, and learning every day through sprint kayaking and training at elite levels. Our primary concern is safety for our athletes, equipment, and other coaches; this is only possible with the support of the club, sponsors, and our program director.

Our team from Hawaii had the third largest team in the country competing at the 2023 national championships all the way in Sarasota, Florida. Ikaika took 3rd place overall and won two awards based on team-boat excellence. Six athletes and two coaches--myself included--were selected to represent the United States in Poznan, Poland for the 2023 Olympic Hopes Regatta, a competition of the best 15-17-year-old sprint kayakers in the world. In preparation for this regatta, I will be coordinating international travel, competition, and the best safe/fun/learning experiences possible for the youth kayakers. I am very happy to return home and prepare for the next year of improvement, travel, and competition!

TREASURER'S REPORT



Aloha membership,

As reported at the September General Membership (GM) Meeting by our Accountant Ben Choi, there was ~\$143,000 in the checking account after outstanding checks were paid and \$49,000 in the Maximizer Savings Account at the close of August 31, 2023. Ben reported that we had a 1/3 insurance premium due of approximately \$27k which has been paid to date.

Music is continuing at HYC, so please check the weekly e mail blasts from the office for times and announcements. We need members to support this benefit to keep it going, so please come out and support your club. Abbey is still working with Touch Tunes to get a digital juke box installed at HYC.

Year-to-Date (YTD) 2023 HYC has revenue of \$1.2M and total costs of \$942k resulting in a net profit of \$234k, which is \$146k more than prior YTD. This is a testament that all the actions we have implemented this year--such as the auto pay and no cash policies, accounts receivables (AR's) collections, and a collections agency for accounts in significant arears--are working. HYC has \$113k more in cash accounts YTD and \$40k more in AR's than in 2022.

Finally, as presented at the September GM Meeting, membership was informed that it cost HYC \$98k to operate for the month of August and we brought in \$81k in revenue resulting in a net loss of \$17k. Historically, August is the slowest income generating month of the year.

Starting October 2023, we are going to aggressively market HYC through iHeart Radio with Big Koa. Abbey is working on a commercial with Spectrum TV with BOG Andy Sexton as the voice-over. We will be posting social media advertisements as well. We are also scheduling a big membership drive between Thanksgiving and Christmas, so stay tuned for details.

As most of membership knows by now, we were unable to negotiate a contract renewal with Chef Sean in the Galley; he will be departing at the end of his contract on October 31, 2023. I am working with Kevin to set up a new Galley in-house with a simple menu that consists of fresh affordable food options. We will also be having a happy hour *pupus* food menu with happy hour drink specials. HYC is already paying for all front-of-house operations. In consultation with our accountant Ben, we have estimated a total monthly cost for the back of house to be approximately \$20k/mo. If we consistently generate income of \$25k/mo.--as Chef Sean has been doing--that will net a profit of \$5k/mo. We will strive to do better with different, new, fresh, and affordable menu options, so please come out and support your new in-house Galley starting November. All Galley income will now go to our club.

It should be noted that the produce vendor overloaded and broke the elevator sprocket, even though they were repeatedly asked not to use it. The elevator is obsolete, and the part is no longer available, so Staff Commodore and BOG Steven Eder is working to get a new sprocket fabricated. The elevator repair company gave us an estimate of \$5k to fix it. Kevin will be working with Chef Sean before he departs to get reimbursement for the \$5k repair from the produce company. If they are unable to get payment from the produce company, Chef Sean will be responsible for the cost.

TREASURER'S REPORT (CONT.)

We are also enforcing boat usage once/quarter, in accordance with HYC by-laws, for all slipholders, including live-a-board starting immediately. Any slipholders who do not comply will be automatically charged one month's extra slip fee (double) on December 31, 2023, in accordance with the by-laws.. Please comply.

As a reminder to everyone, membership voted before COVID to increase membership fees and dues yearly at the current inflation rate or CPI index, whichever is greater, to keep up with current escalating costs. Because inflation rates are decreasing, our accountant, Ben, is calculating a fair rate increase according to HYC departmental expenses. We anticipate the increase will be somewhere around 5% and we will keep membership posted as to what the actual increase will be for 2024.

All year long I have been recommending that we increase minimum spends for 2024. This will need to be voted on by the BOG according to the Standing Rules before the end of this year. I am working to increase revenues by giving member benefits such as providing live music, establishing a new Galley with affordable fresh food options, advertising, and scheduling quarterly membership drives to increase membership. We need more regular members and current membership support. If we can increase membership and revenue, then we may not need to increase minimum spends. We need ALL members to come out and support our club, especially when our new in-house Galley takes over operations in November: Remember, all Galley revenue will then go to HYC rather than an independent contractor.

HYC appreciates all members working together as *ohana*. Let's continue to work together to make the remainder of this year a financial success. Come out and support our club.
